COORDINATION WITH OTHER PROGRAMS

The Township adopted Ordinance 2018-12 establishing a moratorium for roadway openings for a period of five (5) years after the resurfacing of a roadway. Excavations in moratorium streets are discouraged, and when allowed under emergency circumstances as determined by the Township Engineer and Public Works Director, require a full width roadway restoration with the limits exceeding the area of excavation.

Consistent with this policy for private services and to make the most efficient use of resources, the Township coordinates with the Planning Board and public utilities to time improvements such that the need for road re-openings are minimized. For example, drainage and roadway improvements on Buckley Road are dependent upon the completion of a stormwater detention facility constructed by a private entity which was recently completed. In another example, the Greenwood Road Phase I contract was awarded only after a private stormwater collection pipe, a gas main replacement by New Jersey Natural Gas, and the Western Monmouth Utilities Authority's (WMUA) sewer pump station rehabilitation projects were all completed.
